

DESCRIPTION OF PEACE CORPS VOLUNTEER SERVICE

After a competitive application process stressing applicant education, experience, and adaptability, Mr. Cline began Peace Corps training on July 2, 1991 in the Republic of Chad. The twelve-week training included intensive instruction in French as well as some instruction in Arabic. His training also included instruction in the areas of Math methodology; Chadian history, culture, politics, and educational institutions. During the final four weeks of training he taught in a model school program while continuing his training in language and culture. Below is a list of the total number of hours Mr. Cline was given in various areas of instruction during PST (Pre Service Training) and in model school.

A. PST (Pre Service Training)

Mr. Cline was sworn-in as a Peace Corps Volunteer by the U.S. Ambassador on September 27, 1991. Thereafter he was posted in the village of Doba and was responsible to the Ministry of Education during his volunteer service in Chad. He served as a Math teacher assigned to the Lycee (high school) in said village until January of 1992. He then transferred to the village of Gouna-Gaya where he continued his work in a much more rural setting.

In each of the villages, Mr. Cline reported to the director of the school and was responsible for teaching the following courses:

While at post Mr. Cline was able to complete a series of math lesson plans in French which will be used as a resource by incoming math volunteers. Before leaving Chad he began a math project with a second math volunteer consisting of a compilation of various math resources found in Chad and in Cameroon which were then placed in a Peace Corps computer data base. Upon completion, the project will be yet another resource available to incoming math volunteers.

Mr. Cline's volunteer service in Chad ended on July 15, 1992.

Pursuant to Section 5(f) of the Peace Corps Act, 22 U.S.C. and 2504(f) as amended, any former Volunteer employed by the United States Government following his Peace Corps service is entitled to have any period of satisfactory Peace Corps Volunteer service credited for purposes of retirement, seniority, reduction in force, leave, and any other privileges based on length of Government service. Peace Corps service shall not be credited toward completion of the probationary or trial period or completion of any service requirement for career appointment.
